Military Families Join National Lights On Afterschool Rally

Military personnel and their families are among the legions of people who benefit from afterschool programs. That's one reason that thousands of military families will participate in the eighth annual *Lights On Afterschool* this week. America's only national rally for afterschool is organized by the Afterschool Alliance, and this year it will include afterschool programs on military bases in the United States and around the world opening their doors to show community members the fun, engaging, educational activities they offer to students.

"Military families are working families and they depend on afterschool programs to keep their kids safe and inspire them to learn after the school bell rings," said Afterschool Alliance Executive Director Jodi Grant. "This year we kick off the 10th anniversary celebration of 21st Century Community Learning Centers, the chief federal funding stream for afterschool programs. It has funded afterschool programs for military and civilian families – but, still, more than 14 million kids have no supervised activity waiting for them each afternoon. We need more funding if we are to give all children access to the afterschool programs they need."

Lights On Afterschool events being held on military bases this year include:

- ❖ The Bitburg School Age program in **Spangdahlem**, **Germany** will hold a parent/child scavenger hunt on October 18. Lights On Afterschool was launched in October 2000 with 1,200 events. A million people are expected to rally at 7,500 events this year to show their support for afterschool programs and to encourage lawmakers and others to make afterschool programs available to all students who need them. Actress Rhea Perlman is the spokesperson for Lights On Afterschool and California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger is National Chair, a position he has held since 2001. For the first time ever, the Empire State Building in New York City will be lit with yellow floodlights on October 18 in recognition of Lights On Afterschool.
