What Do Parents Need and What Are Out-of-School-Time Programs Able to Offer Right Now? Top Experts to Release National Surveys of Parents, Out-of-School-Time Providers

On Thursday, September 24, at 1 pm ET, the Afterschool Alliance and National Summer Learning Association will release the results of two national surveys that explore what parents need and what afterschool and summer learning programs can provide as schools struggle to find ways to safely reopen. The surveys explore what programs, services and supports were available to students and families this summer; disparities in access to afterschool and summer learning programs; how well these programs are able to meet the needs of parents and families; and how secure they are for the future.
